B (s. ix–x): page 290x216mm; text 2 cols, each 245x75mm; 63 lines; several scribes. *Titulus*, p. 59.

C (s. xi–xii): page 290x216mm; text 2 cols, each 240x75mm; 42 lines; several scribes. *Titulus*, p. 99^a.

Binding: s. xv tooled white leather on boards; two clasps (renewed). Parchment label top centre front cover, COMPUTUS BEDE.

GLOSS A: rare.

DECORATION Beak-headed *I(n)*, p. 3. Elsewhere, simple red outline initials; minor initials in ink, or plain red, or ink outline with red infill. Chapter headings as red capitals, but not consistently throughout. Frequent and clear diagrams, with no extra decoration.

PROVENANCE St Gall (stamp, p. 4).

B (s. xi–xii): text 175x125mm; 23 lines; one scribe for *Op. Sac.* V.

CONTENTS Pp. 4–6 (flyleaves) *Planctus S. Galli* (Schaller, 13647); 6 *Op. Sac.* V.iv (41–55) fragment upside down.

A: pp. 7–58 commentary on *Op. Sac. I–III*, V, inc. ‘Igniculum ingeniolum’ (Cappuyns D¹); *expl.* ‘Glose Boetii Sancte Trinitatis perscripte Deo gratias’; 59–95 *Op. Sac. I–V* with glosses (Cappuyns D²).

B: pp. 96–111 *Op. Sac. V*; 112 *Septem sunt miracula mundi*, here attributed to Bede.

GLOSS

A: plentiful subject headings in capitals in the margin, pp. 59–93, e.g., p. 62 (I) ‘sed divina substantia QUID SIT INTER ESSE DEI ET ETERNORUM QUAE NON SUNT DEUS; neque enim subiectum DEUM QUIA FORMA EST NON FIERI SUBIECTUM. ET HANC FORMAM NON INESSE MATERIE: ex his enim formis MATERIALES FORMAS AB AETERNIS FORMIS DESCENDISSE’. Some glosses in various hands, esp. pp. 59–61, 78–9 and 88–93. Reference signs not systematic.

DECORATION

A: *I(nvestigatam)* in red and buff with internal panels and floral decoration, p. 59. Minor initials and colour spots on capitals within text.

B: rubrication in orange and red.

PROVENANCE

St Gall (p. 3: ?s. xiv).

A homogeneous book, planned as a whole.

Extensive user’s gloss almost throughout. Lemmata underlined.
